ABOUT 450 YEARS AGO, Sir Francis Drake made marked his name in history by circumnavigating the world in a single expedition for the English. This was the first English circumnavigation of the Earth, and the third circumnavigation of the Earth overall for any country at that time.

Because of this and many other voyages, Queen Elizabeth granted Sir Francis Drake a family crest with the Latin motto 'Sic Parvis Magna' which translates as 'Great things from Small Beginnings', a reference to his humble start in life. Great things from small beginnings is the epitome of RCDN as a club. In its 40 years RCDN has made its mark not only in Dumaguete City and Negros Oriental, but in Rotary District 3860.

Although all of our projects have some level of positive effect on the community, one project that embodies Great Things from Small Beginnings is our Citronella project spearheaded by our very own Director Max Tenorio. The reason why it has become successful and now renowned throughout

higher levels of the Rotary organization is because it is: novel; cost effective; effectively communicated to the community; educational; and effective, to name a few. Rotary International Convention in Singapore concludes with optimism

Messages of peace and progress, anticipation for 2025 convention in Calgary inspire attendees

After five days of friendship, excitement, and cultural connections, the 2024 Rotary International Convention in Singapore ended with a focus on the future. Speakers emphasized Rotary's continuing mission to promote peace and goodwill and previewed next year's gathering in Calgary, Canada.

Fostering understanding was a central theme of the day, as Rotary celebrated the 25th year since the Rotary Peace Centers program was announced.

"To believe in peace is to have hope, and to do so, one must be both stubborn and optimistic, and be eager to persist and make a difference." RI President R. Gordon R. McInally emphasized Rotary's long-standing commitment to building peace and noted that the topic has been a key interest almost since Rotary began.

"Our dedication to building a more peaceful world has its ups and downs, but it has been a critical part of how we define ourselves, going back even before the First World War," McInally said. *"From our earliest days, we have always had a vision of our organization as something more than just the people we see right in front of us and the direct results of our service projects."*

The day's breakout sessions included even more discussion of peacebuilding, with topics such as Innovating Peace Education in Times



of Crisis and Understanding the Global Peace Index. xxx

Speakers emphasized that cause-based and interest-based clubs are a popular way to attract new members, noting that clubs can be formed among alumni of the same school, professionals in similar fields, or people who want to address a particular problem.

"Look in your own community for where Rotary is needed," advised Virginia McKenzie of the Rotary Club of The Pacific Northwest Ending Sex Trafficking. She suggested inviting friends, relatives, community leaders, and local media outlets to a club's charter celebration to help it launch successfully.

Krishnan Chittur of the Rotary Club of Hudson Valley, New York, USA, offered another approach during the session We Formed a New Club in One Week, And So Can You!

WHY THE ROTARY YEAR BEGINS 1 JULY

Ever wonder why 1 July is the beginning of the Rotary year? Initially, our conventions played a key role in determining the start date of our fiscal and administrative year.

Rotary's first fiscal year began the day after the first convention ended, on 18 August 1910. The 1911-12 fiscal year also related to the convention, beginning with the first day of the 1911 convention on 21 August.

The next August, the Board of Directors ordered an audit of the International Association of Rotary Clubs' finances. The auditors recommended that the organization end its fiscal year on 30 June to give the secretary and treasurer time to prepare a financial statement for the convention and board, and to determine the proper number of club delegates to the convention.

The executive committee agreed and, in April 1913, designated 30 June as the end of the fiscal year. This also allowed for changes to the schedule for reporting club membership and payments. Even The Rotarian changed its volume numbering system to correspond to the fiscal year (beginning with Volume 5, No. 1, in July 1914).

Rotary continued to hold its annual conventions in July or August until 1917. Delegates to the 1916 event in Cincinnati, Ohio, USA, approved a resolution to hold future conventions in June, mainly because of the heat in cities where most of them occurred. The next one was held 17-21 June in Atlanta, Georgia.

The term "Rotary year" has been used to signify Rotary's annual administrative period since at least 1913. An article in The Rotarian that July noted, "The Rotary year that is rapidly drawing to a close has been signalized by several highly successful joint meetings of Clubs that are so situated as to assemble together easily and conveniently."

Since the executive committee's decision in 1913, the end of the Rotary year has remained 30 June.
