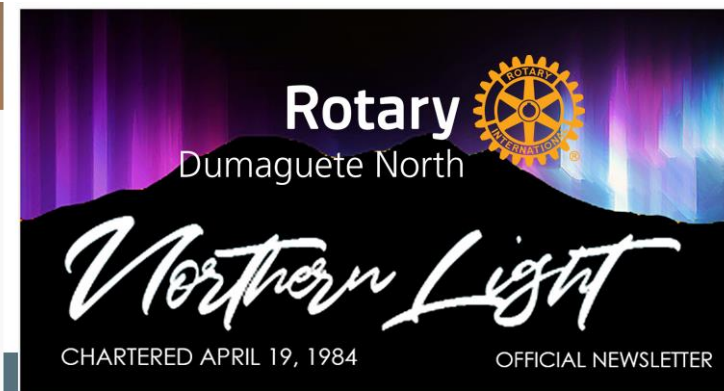

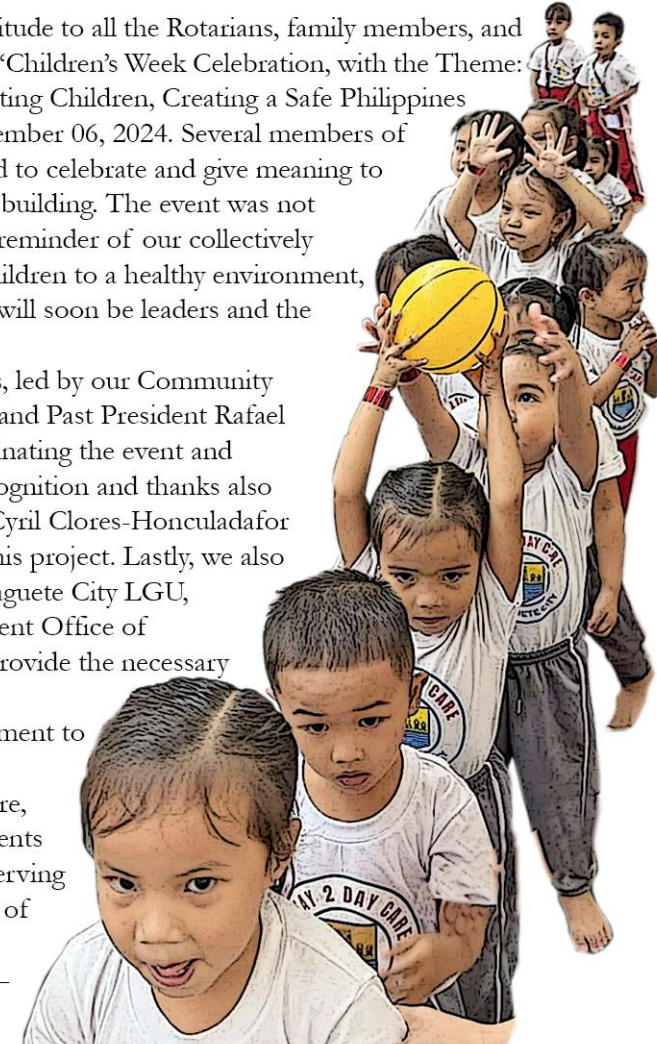
A Heartfelt Thanks to all Our Volunteers for the "Children's Week Celebration"
