SECRETARY'S REPORT



Jan Ashley "Ashley" E. Morelos

Minutes of March 20 meeting:

Pres. Alex Pal called the meeting to order at 6:30 a.m.

1) Sec. Ashley Morelos led the invocation.
 2) After the singing of the Pambansang Awit in the original Spanish language, and the Rotary Hymn, SAA Edo Adriano recited the Four-Way Test and the Mission and Object of Rotary.
 3) After breakfast, PP Boy Diputado led the fellowship singing, with the help of Sec. Ashley and Treas. Gilbert Fuentes. The trio sang the Apo Hiking Society's song, *Ewan*.

4) PP Ran Lim was the Fine Master.
 5) The guest speaker was PP Henry A. Sojor, Charter president of the Negros Oriental State University. PP Henry shared that the Philippines has 112 State Universities and Colleges. The large state universities have at least 50,000 students, such as the University of the Philippines, Mindanao State University in Iligan, and the Polytechnic University of the Philippines in Manila, whose presidents have the rank of Cabinet Secretary. A medium-sized university, like NORSU, has a student population of 30,000 to 49,000, and its president is equivalent to an Undersecretary. A small state university such as Central Mindanao University in Bukidnon and the Siquijor State College have between 15,000 to 29,000 students, and their president's rank is equivalent to an Assistant Secretary. NORSU has 10 campuses in Negros Oriental: two campuses in Dumaguete, two in Bais City, and one each in the City of Bayawan and Guihulngan, and the towns of Pamplona, Mabinay, Sta. Catalina, and Siaton. After serving the Dumaguete Cathedral College, and later the Colegio de Sta. Catalina de Alejandria (COSCA) for 21 years, becoming its vice president, PP Henry moved to the Central Visayas Polytechnic University to be its President. Subsequently, NORSU was created with the help of Gov. Herminio Teves, who rallied his friends in Congress to support the NORSU Bill in the House of Representatives. NORSU also got the strong support of Sen. John Henry Osmeña. The vision of NORSU is to be a General Comprehensive University. While serving as NORSU president, PP Henry was concurrent president of the Jose Rizal Memorial State University in Dapitan City. PP Henry beamed with pride to note that NORSU graduates now top board examinations, bringing honor to Dumaguete and Negros Oriental.

6) **President's Time.** Pres. Alex Pal encouraged Rotarians to register for the Distas which will be held on April 12-13 here in Dumaguete -- upon the encouragement of PDG Ana Bumagat -- because this is a rare time for this event to be held in Dumaguete, and our Rotarians would not anymore have to pay for transportation and hotel accommodations. **Registration for Distas has been extended to Friday, April 5.** Pres. Alex announced that RCDS generated eight registrants who signed up for Distas. **Registration for Distas is P4,700.**

7) The President also encouraged the Rotarians to join the Discon on May 3-5 in Davao City where we have been invited to perform. He said that rehearsals for the choral group are being held three times weekly so that by the **first week of April we can record the song especially with the ones who really cannot make it for some reason**, and to **produce a music video for the background.**

8) PP Ran Lim suggested that VP-Elect Ashley Morelos be also required to attend the PETS/SETS.

With nothing more to discuss, the meeting adjourned at 8:00am

RCDS PRESIDENT'S CORNER

So the historic four-in-one gathering of Rotary District 3860 -- the President-Elect Training Seminar (PETS), the Secretaries-Elect Training Seminar (SETS), the District Training Assembly (DisTAs), and the District Team Training Seminar (DTTS) -- will push through from April 11-13. That's next week already.

If you are not a PE or SE, or you are not one of the four Club Directors whose attendance in the PETS/SETS and DISTAS is required by the District, you will find your attendance in the DISTAS a wonderful opportunity.

Those who are relatively new to Rotary might think that Rotary is just another organization. Well, attending the DISTAS is one great way to expose you to the programs, traditions, and people in Rotary.

You might also learn about Rotary by taking time to read our weekly bulletin, the *Spinning Wheel*; although only about half of our "Active Rotarians" (those who diligently pay their semestral dues) actually attend our regular meetings and participate/contribute towards the success of our activities in Rotary's seven areas of focus.

Suffice it to say that attending the DISTAS and the DISCON is part of any member's "Rotarisation" process.

You will not take pride in calling yourself a genuine Rotarian if you had not attended a DISTAS event or the District Convention -- which we will held on May 3-5 in Davao City.

At this point, you may be thinking about the high costs of joining such events. Registration for the DISTAS is P4,700; while registration for the DISCON is P7,000. Add to that your plane fare and accommodation costs.

And yet, you might ask yourself: Why are Rotarians (generally) willing to travel, take a few days off from work, spend their hard-earned money, "just to attend" these Rotary seminars?

Part of the history of the Rotary Club of Dumaguete South is the fact that our founders, Rtn. Martin "Ting" Matiao and his friend Andres "Andy" Young Ricardo, so loved Rotary that they would not miss any meeting. They would even fly to Dipolog (there was a time when planes flew between Dumaguete and Dipolog) just to make up for their absences in the RCDS meetings.

It's never too late to cultivate among all of us

that genuine love for, and interest in Rotary. We can encourage each other to regularly attend our meetings, and participate in our activities; and when some others cannot do so, to urge them to attend meetings in other Rotary Clubs to make up for their absence. It is in the process of attending other club meetings that we get to know more Rotarians, develop friendships, and expand our circles of influence.

Except for the **examples worth-emulating that have been demonstrated to us by Rtn. Bernard Abangan, PP Ran Lim, and Rtn. Mitch Morelos in their business/work-related/personal trips abroad**, I just realized that this tradition is not anymore being followed by Dumaguete-based Rotarians who normally travel out of Negros Oriental or out of the country.

What is a Paul Harris Fellow?

A Paul Harris Fellow is a person who has been recognized as having done something significant for others through a contribution of \$ 1000, which will be spent on humanitarian efforts around the world.

A Paul Harris Fellow is recognized for service to the club and the community.

The recognition is named after Paul Harris, founder and organizer of the first Rotary Club in Chicago in 1905. He was founder of the Rotary idea, and the first president of the worldwide organization, Rotary International.

Upon Paul Harris' death in 1947, memorial gifts poured in to honor the founder of Rotary. From that time, the Rotary Foundation has been achieving the noble objective

of furthering "understanding and friendly relations between peoples of different nations".

In 1957, the idea of the Paul Harris Fellow recognition was first proposed as a means to promote voluntary giving to the Rotary Foundation.

Although the concept of making \$1,000-gifts to the Foundation was slow in developing, by the early 1970s the program began to gain popularity.

The distinctive Paul Harris Fellow medallion, lapel pin, and a certificate have become highly-respected symbols of a substantial commitment to The Rotary Foundation by Rotarians and friends around the world.

A portrait of faith and service

Ann Fe Lualhati Daing-Bustamante, who retired in 2018 as Executive Judge in Negros Oriental, embodies a life deeply rooted in principles, family, and service to justice.

Born in Zamboanga del Sur, the journey of Ann Fe the past 76 years thus far reflects a commitment to education, familial aspirations, and an unwavering dedication to the rule of law.

Her educational path began under the guidance of Columbian priests in a private school, instilling in her a strong foundation in Catholic values. Her thirst for knowledge led her to the University of San Carlos in Cebu City, where she earned her Bachelor of Arts degree. Inspired by her uncle's successful career as a legal counselor, Fe knew in her heart what she also aspired for. Perhaps unbeknownst to her that time, Fe's parents secretly had dreams for their daughter to one day become a lawyer. Despite financial constraints, but with a determined spirit and the support of her family, Ann Fe pursued her legal studies at Silliman University, obtaining her Bachelor of Laws degree.

It was also during that time at Law school when she met her destiny: Rtn. Elson Bustamante.

Joining the legal profession was serendipitous for Ann Fe, a career path marked with unexpected opportunities and the encouragement of friends. Beginning her career in 1979 as Clerk of Court at the Regional Trial Court-Branch 39, she honed her skills for the next 10 years, and deepened her commitment to the law. In 1989, Judge Fe embraced the challenge when the Supreme Court appointed her Presiding Judge of the Municipal Trial Court of Siaton, serving there for the next 10 years until 1999. Her dedication to her mandate, and her impartiality in the cases she decided earned her a reputation for Excellence. Then Judge Fe was promoted once again as Presiding Judge of RTC-Branch 33 in Dumaguete City, where she continued to uphold the principles of justice and fairness.

Amidst all the accolades they have received in their respective careers, Ann Fe & Rtn. Erp said they both believe that their greatest legacy lies in the children they raised and "trained in



the way they should go". Their three children have since forged their own paths, each contributing to their chosen fields: Ma. Fe pursued further legal education, earning a Juris Doctor degree, a testament to her commitment to excellence in the legal profession; Lyra works as a registered nurse in the US, embodying a dedication to caring for others; and Eulle, a Liberal Arts graduate, works at the Regional Trial Court, continuing the family's tradition.

As a firm believer in 'destiny', Ann Fe Lualhati finds a deeper significance to her name, interpreting it as a symbol of faith and glory.

Her tenure as Executive Judge reflected this spirit of innovation and dedication. Known for her strategic court management, and insistence on efficiency, Ann Fe prioritized the swift resolution of cases, while fostering loyalty among her staff, friends, and family.

Beyond her professional accomplishments, Ann Fe's legacy extends to her role as a loving wife and a doting mother even to her grown children, exemplifying a commitment to familial tradition and excellence.

Her retirement in 2018 at the age of 70 marked the culmination of a distinguished career characterized by integrity, compassion, and dedication to the pursuit of justice.
