Minutes of May 15 meeting:

Pres. Alex Pal called the meeting to order at 6:33 a.m.

PP Henry Sojor fined everyone as that day's Fine Master.

Rtn. Erp Bustamante led the singing of the Rotary Morning Song

Pres. Alex introduced the guests and the speaker for that morning.

Baby Rotarian Ryan Tan Uy gave a talk about airplanes and travel. He said airplanes, whether jet or propeller aircraft, are capable of gliding. Some jets are capable of gliding up to 120 minutes with the engine off. That, he said, is the reason why planes to North America pass through Japan, Alaska and Canada instead of crossing the Pacific Ocean, because they have to have an alternate airport to land in the event of an engine malfunction. He encouraged everyone to know their passenger rights which can be found in the Bill of Rights. He also debunked several misconceptions about air travel, such as airlines deliberately delay or cancel flights to make more money. Ryan also spoke about the tourism potentials of Dumaguete and Negros Oriental, compared with our neighboring provinces of Bohol and Siquijor. He said we need to have more activities and come-ons for tourists.

After the talk, there was no more time to induct Ryan so Pres. Alex said we will reschedule the induction for the next meeting.

Pres. Alex also had to forego the Rotary Information and the President's Time.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:04 a.m.

SPECIAL ROTARY OBSERVANCES

In the annual Rotary calendar several months are designated to emphasize major programs of Rotary International.

January is Rotary Awareness Month. This is a time to expand knowledge of Rotary and its activities among our membership and throughout the community.

February is designated as World Understanding Month. This month was chosen because it includes the birthday of Rotary International, February 23. During the month, Rotary clubs are urged to present programs which promote international understanding and goodwill, as well as launch World Community Service projects in other parts of the world.

World Rotaract Week is the week in which March 13 falls. It's a time when Rotary clubs and districts highlight Rotaract by joining in projects with their Rotaract clubs.
