ROTARY CLUB OF METRO CEBU

ITS HISTORY AND LEADERS





The Rotary Club of Metro Cebu (RCMC) was organized on September 15, 1977 (Theme: Serve to Unite Mankind) as an Extension Club of the Rotary Club of Cebu (RCC), known as the "Mother Club" by many Rotary clubs which it had helped charter. On June 3, 1978, the Rotary Club of Metro Cebu was chartered by Rotary International.

Amador "Morry" Moriles, an advertising executive who used to run Wise Advertising in Cebu City, became the first club president for Rotary Year 1978-1979 (Theme: Reach Out). He undertook such projects as the free clinic at Agus, Mactan; beddings donated to the Bohol Provincial Jail and orthopedic materials and services donated to vehicular accident victims. He served for another year for RY 1979-1980 (Theme: Let Service Light the Way).

Practicing lawyer Luis "Lou" V. Diores became president for RY 1980-1981 (Theme : Take Time to

Serve). His projects included mini blood bank at Cebu City Medical Center (CCMC) costing P60,000.00, cardio vascular ward established at the same hospital, and a training van donated to National Manpower and Youth Council (NMYC).

Charlie F. Adlawan (deceased) took the helm of the RCMC in RY 1981-1982 (Theme: World Understanding and Peace Through Rotary). During his term, he adopted the SAPAK project as the club's continuing project. The club also organized the RC Cebu Central with PP Lou Diores as SGR.

Guillemro "Willie" Balmaceda, who was then a businessman dealing in the construction of swimming pools, became president in RY 1982-1983 (Theme: Mankind is One-- Build Bridges of Friendship Throughout the World). His projects included Support for SAPAK in Compostela, Cebu, equipment donated to the blind masseurs of Cebu and the first "Songs to Remember" concert which raised funds for SAPAK.

Victor "Vic" Young took over in RY 1983-1984 (Theme: Share Rotary -- Serve People). However, he got sick and served only from July - September 1983. The rest of his term was taken over by Eriberto "Bhoy" Melliza (deceased) who was then manager of the Philippine Long Distance Co. (PLDT) in Cebu and later vice president of the same firm.

Ildefonso "Larry" Latorena (deceased), an insurance executive, assumed the presidency in RY 19841985 (Theme: Discover a New World of Service). His projects included organization of RC Bogo (Now Metro Bogo). During his term, the Club presented the first-of-its-kind Journalism Award to Mr. Pedro Calomarde (deceased) who used to edit the defunct Morning Times, a Cebu daily. The award was co-sponsored by San Miguel Corporation (SMC).

Xavier Ledesma (deceased), a corporate communications manager of San Miguel Corporation was president in RY 1985-1986 (Theme: You are the Key). He later became an RI District Governor for the then District 386 (now District 3860). The RCMC Foundation was organized with P30,000.00 as initial funding during his term.





Eddie Dakay became president in RI 1986-1987 (Theme: Rotary Brings Hope). A piano virtuoso, he was a great help in the production of the Club's "Songs to Remember" concerts. He is credited for 40 members registering 100 percent attendance, sent the biggest delegation to DISTAS '87 and DISCON projects, PETS sponsorship, a potable water system installed at Barangay Tulo-Tulo.

Pete Durano became president in RY 1987-1988 (Theme: Rotarians -- United in Service-Dedicated to Peace). During his term, the club supported 15 Share-a-Child scholars, sponsored PolioPlus Seminar and handled polioplus vaccination in some Cebu City barangays, staged the "an Evening of Chamber Music" fundraiser.

Former Cebu Vice Governor Salutario J. Fernandez (deceased), a lawyer, took over in RY 1988-1989 (Theme: Put Life into Rotary -- Your Life). The US \$300,000.00 Mananga Watershed Project was launched during his term.

Jose "Joe" Tan (deceased), a retired Shell Philippines Inc. sales executive became president in RY 1989-1990 (Theme: Enjoy Rotary!). He was awarded the "Rotarian of the Year" during his term. He later became an Assistant District Governor (ADG).

Jose Utzurrum, a businessman, became president in RY 1990-1991 (Theme: Honor Rotary with Faith and Enthusiasm). He was then elected chairman of the Cebu Council of Rotary Club Presidents and concurrent Chairman of the RCMC Foundation.

Jake Marques who later became Cebu Port Authority (CPA) general manager and now a businessman, assumed presidency in RY 1991-1992 (Theme: Look Beyond Yourself).

Lawrence Aliac, Sr., a businessman, became president in RY 1992-1993 (Theme: Real Happiness is Helping Others). This was the 15th year of the Club. During his term, the club hosted the Cebu TriDiscon which raised funds for the RCMC Foundation.

Wyben Briones, a Neurosurgeon, took over the leadership in RY 1993-1994 (Theme: Believe in What You Do -- Do What You Believe In). This was the year RCMC were full of euphoria due to the success of the Tri-Discon hosting. PP Wyben launched the following projects: Club Reforestation Project, bloodletting, Ormoc City Relief Operation leading a team of 70 medical practitioners staying 8 days in flashflood-ravaged Ormoc, launched "Songs To Remember Part V" organized by PP Jun Satorre generating P200,000.00 for the Club's coffers enough to support new projects for the club.

Under Ramon Torres (deceased) who served in RY 1994-1995 (Theme : Be a Friend), a Regional Trial Court judge, the club garnered the Presidential Citation for Community Concerns.

Leandro "Jun" Ocampo (deceased), a businessman, became president in RY 1995-1996 (Theme: Act with Integrity Serve with Love Work for Peace). His term reaped five RI awards through its Kansas Shares with Cebu Medical Mission Project. In addition, the





Club also got the RI Presidential Citation for Integrity, Love and Peace, Special Challenge of RI Prexy Herbert Brown, RI Golden Century Citation (PDG Xavier Ledesma), Rotary Foundation RI District Service Award (PDG Xavier Ledesma Rotary Foundation RI District Service Award).

Don Calvo, a sporting goods businessman became president in RY 1996-1997 (Build the Future with Action and Vision). PP Don is one of the Club's leaders who had an eye for sanitation. It was during his term that the Club had initiated a big sanitation project in a blighted area under the old MandaueOpon Bridge in Mandaue City. The facility, composed of a dozen toilets, is still working to this day and has contributed to the sanitation in the area.

Manuel "Jun" Satorre, a lawyer-journalist, became president in RY 1997-1998 (Theme: Show Rotary Cares for your community for our world for its people). He undertook the following projects: He set up the Olango Rotary Village Corps and launched the Olango RCMC Livelihood project, initiated medical/dental/surgical missions in Olango island and Balamban, Cebu led by PP Wyben Briones with the help of the Rotaract Club of Metro Cebu Community-based, the Rotaract Club of RC University District under PP Serge Damo of SWU and the interns and doctors of Cebu Institute of Medicine (CIM) care of PP Wyben Briones.

Fruto Teodorico, a banker, was president in RY 1998-1999 (Theme: Follow Your Rotary Dream). During his term, he undertook the RCMC sponsorship of the movie premier (You've Got Mail) and raised P107,780 to help finance several projects, among them, the Rotary Blood Service Support Program, Project Help-A-Medical Mission in Argao, Cebu; Operation Tuli, 81 major operations at Operation Restore Hope.

Mila Demecillo, a businesswoman, became president in RY 1999 (Theme: Rotary 2000: Act with Consistency, Credibility, Continuity). Her term was one of the most colorful as it gave the club great honors when it won the Significant Achievement Award for the Millennium Babies Project, where the first baby boy and baby girl born at the start of the new millennium were given college scholarships by the club. Unfortunately however, during the term of PP Mars Pastor (RY 2001-2002), Demecillo's membership from the Club was terminated by the RCMC Board after hearing a petition filed by some RCMC members asking for her resignation.

Cesar Vesuna, another banker, served in RY 2000-2001 (Theme: Create Awareness Take Action). He is credited for spearheading Operation Restore Hope. He was also a factor in organizing RCMC's hosting of Distas 2001. RCMC also launched the Vitamin A project and others.

Mars Pastor, an engineer-businessman, was president in RY 2001-2002 (Theme: Mankind is our Business). His term was also a very colorful one. For it was at this time that RCMC was rocked by infighting over a petition against PP Mila. Under his leaderhsip, he led the launching of several projects for RCMC such as the initiative for the Improvement of the Maternity Ward and Delivery Room of the Cebu City Medical Center and the successful





Operation Restore Hope at the Opon Emergency Hospital.

Peter Yap, a chemical engineer who is a top bank executive, was president in RY 2002-2003 (Theme: Sow the Seeds of Love). Although he was working in Cebu as VP of a big bank, he was promoted to Manila cutting short his term. He was quickly replaced by Vic Balbuena, a doctor, who is completing PP Peter's term.

Dr. Vic Balbuena, an internist, had replaced PP Peter and has been doing well to provide leadership to the Club. When he took over, more new RCMC members were inducted. PP Jun Ocampo's untimely death happened during PP Vic's watch.

Several projects were launched during Lambert Lim Lam Thai's watch as the Club's Silver Anniversary President for RY 2003-2004 (Lend a Hand), among them the continuation of Operation Restore Hope. The club also garnered many awards.

After Lambert Lim Lam Thai, Rudy Cabrera, a former long-time member of the Cebu City Council, took the helms of the club for RY 2004-2005 (Theme: Celebrate Rotary), followed by banker Danilo 'Danny' Quinto, another banker for RY 2005-2006 (Theme: Service Above Self).

President Gema Pido is the club's 28th president for RY 2006-2007 (Theme :Lead the Way) and only the second lady president of the club. Under her term, the club secured some P100,000 worth of books worth of books for children which were donated to various schools who already had libraries.

Elton Cerna took the helms of the club for RY 2007-2008 (Theme: Rotary Way). But his term was cut short when he transferred residence and business to Davao City. Eddie Barrita, a lawyerjournalist, continued the rest of the Rotary Year. It was during this Rotary Year that the club started the "Light an Island Project" in which lamps made of energy efficient light-emitting diodes (LEDs) were distributed to residents of Pamilacan Island in Bohol. The Sapak Project and the Operation Restore Hope were also continued.

Andres "Jun" Llanos, Jr. was the club president for RY 2008-2009 (Theme: Make Dreams Real). Operation Restore Hope was continued. The club also sponsored a college scholar (Jessica Degamo) and sent to the United States Cherry Mae Espedilla for a series of surgeries for the restoration of her nose which was all destroyed by an infection when she was still a baby.

Susan U. Valmayor, a dentists, took the helms of the club for RY 2009-2010 (Theme: The Future is in Your Hands). During her term, Operation Restore Hope was continued, the club continued the college scholarship of Jessica Degamo and conducted several medical missions, including the Camotes Medical Mission.

Dr. Jose 'Jojo' Z. Flordelis, an orthopedic surgeon, was club president for RY 2010-2011 (Theme: Building Communities --- Bridging Continents) and raised funds through the





promotion of solar flashlights, continued the Pamilacan project, Camotes Medical Mission, feeding of orphans and street children at Balay Samaritano, Operation Restore Hope. The club also sponsored another college scholar (Joy Grancapal).

Dr. Neil Oliver Camonggol, a neurosurgeon, took the helms of the club for RY 2011-2012 (Theme: Reach Within to Embrace Humanity). During his term, the club started the massive anti-dengue campaign with the use of larvicide to eradicate mosquitoes that carry the deadly dengue disease and other diseases. The club also continued Operation Restore Hope and the college scholarship of Joy Grancapal.

Frank Crijns was club president for RY 2012-2013 (Theme: Peace Through Service). He led the Monte de Ramos project. The boy was born blind and unable to walk. His eyes were operated and is able to see. He is undergoing treatment to be able to walk. During his term, the club held a medical mission in Samar with the "Halad ha Barrangay." The club also sent a big relief and medical mission to Compostela Valley which was hit by a typhoon and continued Operation Restore Hope, the Pamilacan project and the anti-dengue campaign.

Florita Hall was club president for RY 2013-2014 (Theme: Engage Rotary, Change Lives) when a 7.2 magnitude earthquake jolted Cebu and Bohol On October 15, 2013 and Super Typhoon Yolanda, the strongest typhoon in recorded history, hit northern Cebu, Tacloban and other parts of Eastern Visayas on November 8, 2013. RCMC also responded during the collission of two ships, St. Thomas Aquinas and Sulpicio lines stationing itself at the Talisay Fish port at Pier 4. President Hall raised millions of pesos for relief efforts. Food, bottled water and carpentry tools were given to earthquake and typhoon victims even in the farthest areas with the help of the All-terrain Medical Relief Organization (AMRO). The club also continued the Pamilacan project to acquire a desalination equipment, the anti-dengue campaign but suspended Operation Restore Hope due to the calamities.

The club is now in the hands of Floram Limotlimot, a banker RY 2014-2015 (Theme: Light Up Rotary). Her projects include the rebuilding of schools in Kinatarkan Island, Sta. Fe, Bantayan Island which were destroyed be Super Typhoon Yolanda. She also continued the anti-dengue drive, the Pamilacan water desalination system and the Operation Restore Hope.

Vicente Gabriel C. Balbuena RY 2015-2016 (Theme: Be a Gift to the World). Balbuena, a cardiologist, He continued all the major projects of the club, including the Pamilacan Island project, the massive dengue mosquito eradication project, undertook several medical missions, and initiated the feeding program for the poorest among students of the Don Carlos Gothong Memorial High School in Cebu City.

Eddie O. Barrita RY 2016-2017(Theme: Serving Humanity). The term of Barrita, a lawyer and journalist, saw the construction of 12 toilets for the Ati community in Barangay South Poblacion, Naga City in southern Cebu. This is in response to the challenge of





improving sanitation and health among tribe members. The project evolved into the "Pansayan sa Katawhan" (Kubeta ng Bayan) project with funding support from the Rotary Club of Campbelltown in Australia and resulted in the construction of 50 toilets in Barangay Suba, Jao Island, Talibon, Bohol.

Marjorie Ann L. Bernardo RY 2017 – 2018 (Theme: Rotary Making a Difference) Dr. Bernardo, a dentist, initiated a flurry of projects for the club. Among them were the Paddle for the Planet project, which was started in the past Rotary Year, dental mission and giving of gifts to children who are victims of sexual abuse together with the CURE Foundation of Rtn. Bart van Oost, district-wide bloodletting, support for free cataract surgery, and continued the club's feeding program for the Ati community and the Gothong Night High School.

Roberto Tito Pacana RY 2018-2019 (Theme: Be the Inspiration) With the theme embedded in us, we try to breath Rotary wherever we are and 'be an inspiration' to communities, friends...and be a witness of what Rotary is..inviting and inspiring them to be one of us.

Catherine Cusi RY 2019-2020 (Theme: Rotary Connects the World) RI President Mark Daniel Maloney's theme for 2019-20, Rotary Connects the World, asks Rotarians to strengthen the many ways that Rotary Connects the World, building the connections that allow talented, thoughtful, and generous people to unite and take meaningful action through Rotary service.

Mary Ann Soria RY 2020-2021 (Theme: Rotary Opens Opportunities) The theme 'Rotary Opens Opportunities', is encouraging Rotarians around the world to seize the many opportunities Rotary offers to enrich their lives and the communities in which they serve. RI President Holger Knaack noted Rotary isn't just a club for people to join, but rather "an invitation to endless opportunities," He emphasized that Rotary creates pathways for members to improve their lives and the lives of those they help through service projects. PP Mary Ann was very dynamic and had so much achievements during her term. As part of her passion she pursue to charter the cause-based club of the Rotary Club of Hearing and Speech.

BOARD MEETING






SUCCESSION PLANNING



The **Rotaract Club of Metro Cebu** (Community-based) which has been in service for 26 years and the **Rotaract Club of Metro Cebu - CIT Chapter** (School-based) which has been in service for 39 years.

Here are some highlights of their accomplishments this RY 2023-2024.

THE ROTARACT CLUB OF METRO CEBU



The Rotaract Club of Metro Cebu is a community-based organization of young leaders and professionals. Led by Hope-Creating President Jan Dale Carlo Catalonia, this club is one of the well-awarded and best performing Rotaract Clubs in District 3860.

Induction Rites and Handover Ceremonies (August 2023): The **Rotaract Club of Metro Cebu** welcomed and inducted new members to the club for Rotary Year 2023-2024, making them one of the few clubs with **positive membership growth** in the District.



New Rotary Year Celebration with the Kids (July 2023): To celebrate the start of the Hope-Creating Year, the Rotaract Club of Metro Cebu joined hands with other clubs in the Cebu Council of Rotaract Clubs to conduct a children's party in Lapu-Lapu City.

Present in this endeavor from the club were President Jan Dale Carlo Catalonia, PP Francis Baraga, PP Vhon Chrisnan Ganuza, and VP Bernarda Panilagan.



Sastre sa Kaugmaon: Tailors as our Future (June 2023 and August 2023): One of the flagship projects of the Rotaract Club of Metro Cebu is Sastre sa Kaugmaon which aims to provide livelihood to out-of-school youth and jobless mothers in Cordova. This is achieved through turnover of multiple functioning sewing machines and constant livelihood training sessions.

This project was awarded as **2nd Place** (Silver Award) for the **Edison Ong National Awards 2023,** receiving a grant of Php 15,000.



DENGUARD: Guarding Communities against Dengue (June 2023 and August 2023): With hopes of alleviating the situation of dengue in communities around Cebu City and Talisay City, the Rotaract Club of Metro Cebu in partnership with Rotaract Club of Metro Cebu CIT Chapter conducted a series of information campaigns and larvicide distribution.



This project was awarded as the Most Outstanding Project for Disease Prevention and Treatment during the 2024 District Conference ROYALS Awards Night.





UNCOVER Basic Orientation Seminar for Rotaract (August 2023): The Rotaract Club of Metro Cebu conducted an orientation for new and old members to set expectations and introduce the world of Rotaract and Rotary at the start of the year.

Such endeavor led to a fruitful year for the club, allowing the Rotaract Club of Metro Cebu to end the Rotary Year with the **Platinum Distinction for the Completion of the DRR's Thrust** which is a distinction given to less than 10 clubs out of the 81 clubs in the District.



Hike to End Polio for a Cause (November 2023): The Rotaract Club of Metro Cebu conducted several activities to support Rotary International's mission of ending polio. This includes the Walk to End Polio in October and the Hike to End Polio in November 2023.

The club was later awarded with a special recognition as a **Polio Plus Giving Club** with President **Jan Dale Carlo Catalonia** as the sole **Polio Plus Society member** of the club.



Harvest of Hope: Helping the Farmers of Alambijud, Argao (December 2023): The Rotaract Club of Metro Cebu partnered with the Rotaract Club of Metro Cebu - CIT Chapter, the Rotaract Club of National University of Singapore, and the Rotary Club of Metro Cebu to serve the farming community in the mountainous barangay of Alambijud in Argao.



The project was in collaboration with the Organisadong Grupo ng Mag-uumang Diyosnon (OGMAD) of Alambijud where the Rotaractors handed over 400 meters of HDPE or high density polyethylene pipes to improve water access and agricultural productivity.

Through the impact of the project, Harvest of Hope was awarded as the **Exemplary Project for Collaboration** in Baguio City and a **Finalist for the Outstanding Project for Community Economic Development** in Surigao City, Philippines.









CHEERS Mandaue (December 2023): The Rotaract Club of Metro Cebu in partnership with Dilaab Digitals conducted a Christmas Party for the kids in Brgy. Jagobiao, Mandaue City. This was supported by their local government unit and was attended by 100 children.



EmpowHER: Welcome to Womanhood (March 2024 and April 2024): In support to Rotary International's focus on Maternal and Child Health and Empowering Girls, the Rotaract Club of Metro Cebu conducted a project focused on fighting the stigma around menstrual health and menstruation among young girls.

More than 900 sanitary pads were distributed to the two partner communities. This project eventually got awarded as a **Finalist for the Exemplary Project on Empowering Girls** in Baguio City and the **Most Outstanding Project for Maternal and Child Health** in Surigao City, Philippines.







The Rotaract Club of Metro Cebu attended all district and national functions in Rotaract: RDLT 2023 (Butuan), RDLT 2024 (Tacloban), DISCON 2024 (Surigao), and GEAR Awards 2024 (Baguio) where the club received Gold Distinction and Jan Dale Carlo Catalonia got awarded as one of the Top 10 Exemplary Rotaractors in the Philippines.



The Rotaract Club of Metro Cebu ended the Hope-Creating Year with a bang, after being recognized as a Finalist for the Outstanding Club of the Year, Finalist for the Outstanding President of the Year, and Finalist for the Outstanding Secretary of the Year.

The club also received the **Platinum Distinction** for RY 2023-2024 along with **28 other District Awards** during the ROYALS Night of the 40th District Conference in Surigao & Siargao, Philippines from June 21 to June 24, 2024.







THE ROTARACT CLUB OF METRO CEBU CIT CHAPTER



The **Rotaract Club of Metro Cebu CIT Chapter** consists of passionate **student leaders** dedicated to serving the community through outreach programs. Balancing their academic responsibilities, these rotaractors exemplify **volunteerism** and a **commitment** to making a **positive impact.**

In **August 2023**, the **Rotaract Club of Metro Cebu CIT Chapter** held joint induction rites and handover ceremonies, welcoming and inducting **new officers and members** for the Rotary Year 2023-2024. This achievement positioned them as one of the few clubs in the District with **positive membership growth**.







The Rotaract Club of Metro Cebu CIT Chapter consists of passionate student leaders dedicated to impactful community service. Despite limited funding and relying on fundraising, minor sponsorships, and partnerships, they have successfully implemented over 30 projects, benefiting more than 550 individuals, including 200+ students, 30+ farmers, 20 cancer patients, 70+ persons with disabilities, and 3 public schools. Focused on contributing to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), they also support international causes through donations to The Rotary Foundation, including \$150 for **polio eradication**. Recognized as the **Top 2** in membership growth in District 3860 at the June 2024 District Conference, their commitment to service and volunteerism shines brightly.

These **impressive numbers** reflect that, despite being a **student-led organization**, their unwavering commitment is evident in the tangible outcomes of their efforts. The Rotaract Club of Metro Cebu CIT Chapter stands as a testament to the power of passion, collaboration, and relentless effort in driving positive societal transformation.





In alignment with Brigada Eskwela, empowered 19 students who doesn't have accesss to basic school supplies at Hagdan Elementary School on Kinatarkan Island, Cebu-farthest north island of Cebu on August 12, 2023 in partnership with JMR Foundation and Rotary Club of Metro Cebu, they provided essential school supplies, aiming to nurture future leaders and drive positive change within the community.



Rotacart: Bridging Gaps in Education, exemplifies the power of perseverance and dedication. This project aims to donate a mini library to Cadulawan Integrated School, ensuring students in mountainous areas have easy access to reading materials. Despite challenges, our Rotaract team successfully reached the school, bringing essential donations that brought joy to the pupils' faces. Additionally, a Book Donation Drive was conducted to gather reading materials for implementation.



Soap Up for Success (July 2024). This project focused on teaching students from Pardo National High School eco-friendly dishwashing liquid production skills at Barangay Kinasang-an, Cebu in partnership with Junior Philippine Institute of Chemical Engineers - CIT University Chapter and Kinasang-an Sangguniang Kabataan.

Aligned with SDG 4 and SDG 12, the workshop aimed to promote **sustainable livelihoods** by enhancing participants' understanding of chemical processes and encouraging the adoption of sustainable practices.



Project DEPENSA (April 2024) a Basic Self-Defense Orientation Seminar and training aimed at empowering 30 high school student leaders with essential self-defense techniques and strategies. Led by a dedicated coach - Stayze Agujar who is also an officer of our club, the seminar emphasized the importance of preparedness and personal safety. Through engaging workshops and hands-on demonstrations, participants gained confidence, resilience, and a sense of empowerment.


