Warm Greetings!


Thank you for your attendance in today's meeting!

RCMC's ROCKIN' 60s goes BALLROOM

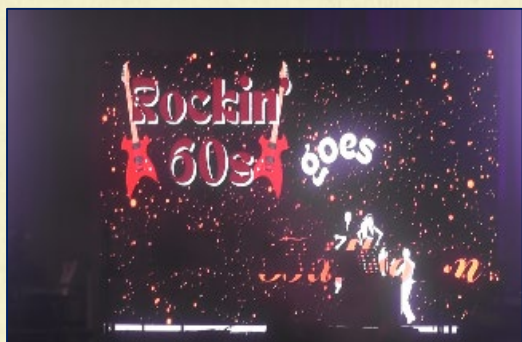
Post-Sinulog Dinner-concert Fund-raising Event
