The foundation currently has over 20 projects in six South East Asian countries.





























Health On Wheels 2025 @ Alcoy, Cebu (15 February 2025)

The Rotary Club of Metro Cebu, together with the Rotaract Clubs of Metro Cebu Community-based and CIT-University, conducted a medical mission last February 15, 2025 at the Santa Rosa de Lima Parish in Alcoy, Cebu.

The medical mission, which is aptly called "Health On Wheels", is a continuing service project delivered to different areas in Cebu and neighboring provinces.

As one of the flagship projects of RCMC, Health On Wheels aims to bring wellness and medical services to communities in need of medical care.

In the Health On Wheels project in Alcoy, RCMC was able to deliver 142 medical consultations, 83 random blood sugar testing and given out around 120 pairs of reading glasses, to parishioners and residents of Poblacion, Alcoy, Cebu.

RCMC is grateful for the generosity of the Rotary Club of Cebu West for the additional medicines, Hermanos Y Hermanas de Zamboanga for the reading glasses, and the Sta. Rosa de Lima Parish community for organizing the venue, registration and crowd control, and for providing food and refreshments to the RCMC members and volunteers.
