#### HISTORY OF THE ROTARY CLUB OF SAN JUANICO

n 1974, while contemplating on the elevating philanthropic movements in the Philippines, five Rotarians braved to ask a question which then marked a significant epoch in the Rotary Club history. "Is the City of Tacloban ready for another Rotary Club?" With these five reputable pillars of the Rotary, this query was answered and made into reality.

The five gentlemen placed their organizational acumen to the force and came out with an answer, without much trying, that indeed Tacloban City needed another Rotary Club. These five intrepid Rotarians were Graciano "Naning" "Militante, Antonio "Nits" Montilla, Jose "Nene" Solis, Gil "Litong" Diaz, and Antonio "Tony" Molabola.

They combed the professional circles of Tacloban and came out with 25 new recruits. The group was diverse, but they blended well and the enthusiasm and exuberance of resources yet untapped throbbed every minute they met.

Sometime in November of 1974, the provisional Rotary Club of San Juanico first met and elected its first set of officers. The list of this provisional set of officers and other documents attesting to the birth of the club were sent to the Rotary International for approval.

Six months after, on May 6, 1975, Rotary International officially chartered the Rotary Club of San Juanico and officially recognized its provisional set of officers as the Charter Officers of the Club.

Charter President Tony Molabola then focused all its effort to seeing to the first major activity of the club – its Charter Presentation. Finally on July 12, 1975, two months after its official charter, District Governor Bading Angala, IPDG Marianing Ilano, and DGN Luing Fran came to Tacloban City and presented to the new club its Certificate of Charter.

Immediately, a hive of new ideas on how to make the club respond to the ideals of Rotary came out from its members. Among the most notable, which eventually became the cornerstone of the club's community involvement, was the project "Operasyon Paglaum," a medical-dental civic action started by the club in 1976.

As subsequent testimonies from all its beneficiaries attest, this project gave the club a greater enthusiasm to pursue the project. From an initial launching in a barangay in Tacloban City where free medicines, dental care, primary medical care, and some minor surgeries where performed, the project took off and

reached out to areas outside the city. Eventually, the project would reach barangays in Southern Leyte, the islands of Biliran, Samar, and Leyte, benefitting thousands of indigent families.

It was a much-anticipated activity that the Anns, the members of the Rotaract Club of San Juanico (organized by the Club at the then Divine Word University of Tacloban) and even whole families of member Rotarians would not have had second thoughts of giving the project wherever it was held in their time. In the project, they found a sense of fulfillment and thought that the Rotary Club of San Juanico could make a difference in the communities.

Eventually, the efforts of the club did not go unnoticed. In 1977, the Rotary International cited this project and awarded the club the "Most Significant Achievement Award in 1977." Giving more meaning to the citation was the fact that the Rotary Club of San Juanico was the only club in the country to be given such an award by Rotary International in that year.

Not resting on this distinguished recognition, the club looked for greater opportunities for service and eventually helped organize the Rotary Club of Calbayog in 1998 during the incumbency of Pres. Noel Siozon and the Rotary Club of Limasawa, Maasin, in 1989 during the time of Pres. Pabs Quianzon.

As this young club grew, so did its collective efforts become known in the district. This recognition saw the second president of the Club and one of the original five, Graciano "Naning" Militante, arising to become the first "Leyteňo" District Governor of RI District 3860 in 1980 to 1981. Five years later, 1982-1983 Club President Roque Tiu followed suit and was elected District Governor in Rotary Year 1986-1987. The 3rd San Juanico Rotarian who occupied the highest position in District 3860 as District Governor for Rotary Year 2002-2003 is PP Pablo "Pabs" P. Quianzon. Thirteen years after, the club's 2000-2001 President Buddy Estudillo became the 4th San Juanico Rotarian who became District 3860's Governor for 2015-2016.

Over the years, the Rotary Club of San Juanico has grown and found meaning in serving various indigent families without fail, from being just a challenge and an answer to a question several decades ago, has carved a niche in Rotary history. It will continue to create its own distinction, as its memberships continue to answer to the call for service and earn for themselves the honor of being called "ROTARIANS."

#### **MEET THE CLUB PRESIDENT FOR RY 2024-2025**

r. Erwin Vincent G. Alcala is one of the distinguished leaders of the Accountancy Profession, known for his exceptional dedication and contributions to the capacity building of professional accounting organizations here and abroad. As the President of Saint Paul School of Professional Studies, as Technical Consultant of the Commission on Higher Education and as an officer of the ASEAN Federation of Accountants, he plays a pivotal role in driving initiatives aimed at strengthening the accounting profession in the ASEAN Region, a testament to his achievements and leadership in the fields of accountancy and higher education.

He was the FY 2022-2023 National President of the Philippine Institute of Certified Public Accountants (PICPA) in time for the 100th Anniversary of the Accountancy Profession in the Philippines, and the first national president to completely visit all 84 chapters of PICPA from Batanes to Jolo bringing the



national leadership to the more than 200,000 certified public accountants all over the country. He paved way for the official recognition of PICPA as the Accredited Integrated Professional Organization of CPAs in the Philippines with the Professional Regulation Commission.

As Chairman of the Board and President of Saint Paul School of Professional Studies (SPSPS), he made significant strides in the field of higher education. He made sure that SPSPS continue to uphold a standard of academic excellence to remain at the forefront of providing quality education in accountancy, business, real estate service and law as evidenced by the several topnotchers and passers in Licensure and Certification Examinations to include the most recent 10th Placer in the Philippine Bar Examination from SPSPS.

Dr. Alcala's dedication to the profession and the academe earned him the recognition as the Philippines' Most Outstanding Certified Public Accountant in 2004 and most recently, the Ease of Doing Business Champion Award presented by the Philippine Securities and Exchange Commission.

He earned his Doctor of Philosophy in Finance and Accounting from the University of Bristol in England, United Kingdom where he also obtained his Master In International Business Degree. He completed the Diploma in Organizational Development from the New York University and the Diploma in Higher Education Administration from Harvard University, USA.

Dr. Alcala joined the Rotary Club of San Juanico in 2010 sponsored by Past President Bong Cellona. He served as the Club Administrator before going on leave to take the leadership role of Philippine CPAs.

He is married to Mercy Bocateja-Alcala and blessed with one child Kriz Mae Eloise who is now married to Jomari Jess Abellar, CPA.
