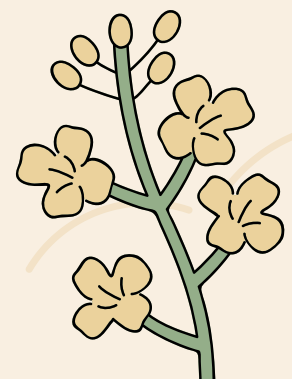
But her impact goes beyond the field. As founding member of the Black Mammologists movement, she's breaking barriers in conservation.
